Keynote Speaker

The Keynote Speaker for the Symposium will be Mr Martin J. Hatlie JD who will also be facilitating the first Australian Patients for Patient Safety Workshop in Perth from July 7 – 9 2009.

Mr Hatlie is currently the CEO for the Coalition for Quality and Patient Safety of Chicagoland. He serves on the Patients for Patient Safety Steering Committee, an action area of the World Health Organization’s World Alliance on Patient Safety.

In 1996 Mr Hatlie was instrumental in developing the first Annenberg Conference on Patient Safety. In 1997 he coordinated the establishment of the National Patient Safety Foundation and served as its founding Executive Director (1997-99).

Mr Hatlie has authored numerous publications addressing patient safety and medical liability issues.
